**The Whole Burnt Offering – Leviticus 1**

## **The Blood!**

Ephesians 2:13 (NKJV) – But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

Romans 3:24-25 – <sup>24</sup> being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup> whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith, to demonstrate His righteousness, because in His forbearance God had passed over the sins that were previously committed.

Revelation 1:5-6 (NKJV) – To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood, <sup>6</sup> and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him *be* glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Ephesians 1:7 – <sup>7</sup> In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace.

Romans 5:9 (NKJV) – Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.

“Blood” occurs 424 times in the Bible (NKJV).

## **Notes**

## **Burnt offering of Leviticus, chapter 1.**

- **עלה** [*'olah*] – This is the word for to ascend or to go up. (Leviticus 1:3, 4, 6, 9, 13, 14, & 17).

Hebrews 12:28-29 (NKJV) – <sup>28</sup> Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us have grace, by which we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear. <sup>29</sup> For our God is a consuming fire.

Exodus 24:16-18 (NKJV) – <sup>16</sup> Now the glory of the LORD rested on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days. And on the seventh day He called to Moses out of the midst of the cloud. <sup>17</sup> The sight of the glory of the LORD was like a consuming fire on the top of the mountain in the eyes of the children of Israel. <sup>18</sup> So Moses went into the midst of the cloud and went up [*'olah*] into the mountain. And Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights.

## **The 10 Commandments.**

Numbers 15:37-41 (NKJV) – <sup>37</sup> Again the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>38</sup> “Speak to the children of Israel: Tell them to make tassels on the corners of their garments throughout their generations, and to put a blue thread in the tassels of the corners. <sup>39</sup> And you shall have the tassel, that you may look upon it and remember all the commandments of the LORD and do them, and that you *may* not follow the harlotry to which your own heart and your own eyes are inclined, <sup>40</sup> and that you may remember and do all My commandments, and be holy for your God. <sup>41</sup> I *am* the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, to be your God: I *am* the LORD your God.”

Leviticus 1:1-4 (NKJV) – <sup>1</sup> Now the LORD called to Moses, and spoke to him from the tabernacle of meeting, saying, <sup>2</sup> “Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: ‘When any one of you brings an offering to the LORD, you shall bring your offering of the livestock—of the herd and of the flock. <sup>3</sup> ‘If his offering is a burnt sacrifice of the herd, let him offer a male without blemish; he shall offer it of his own free will at the door of the tabernacle of meeting before the LORD. <sup>4</sup> Then he shall put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him.

1 Peter 1:19 (NKJV) – ... precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot....

The door of the Tabernacle.

John 10:7 (NKJV) – ... I am the door of the sheep.

Leviticus 1:5-17 (NKJV) –

<sup>5</sup> He is to slaughter the young bull before the LORD, and then Aaron's sons the priests shall bring the blood and sprinkle it against the altar on all sides at the entrance to the Tent of Meeting. <sup>6</sup> He is to skin the burnt offering and cut it into pieces. <sup>7</sup> The sons of Aaron the priest are to put fire on the altar and arrange wood on the fire. <sup>8</sup> Then Aaron's sons the priests shall arrange the pieces, including the head and the fat, on the burning wood that is on the altar. <sup>9</sup> He is to wash the inner parts and the legs with water, and the priest is to burn all of it on the altar. It is a burnt offering, an offering made by fire, an aroma pleasing to the LORD.

<sup>10</sup> “ ‘If the offering is a burnt offering from the flock, from either the sheep or the goats, he is to offer a male without defect. <sup>11</sup> He is to slaughter it at the north side of the altar before the LORD, and Aaron's sons the priests shall sprinkle its blood against the altar on all sides. <sup>12</sup> He is to cut it into pieces, and the priest shall arrange them, including the head and the fat, on the burning wood that is on the altar. <sup>13</sup> He is to wash the inner parts and the legs with water, and the priest is to bring all of it and burn it on the altar. It is a burnt offering, an offering made by fire, an aroma pleasing to the LORD.

<sup>14</sup> “ ‘If the offering to the LORD is a burnt offering of birds, he is to offer a dove or a young pigeon. <sup>15</sup> The priest shall bring it to the altar, wring off the head and burn it on the altar; its blood shall be drained out on the side of the altar. <sup>16</sup> He is to remove the crop with its contents and throw it to the east side of the altar, where the ashes are. <sup>17</sup> He shall tear it open by the wings, not severing it completely, and then the priest shall burn it on the wood that is on the fire on the altar. It is a burnt offering, an offering made by fire, an aroma pleasing to the LORD.
