## March 2, 2012 Messianic Service The Prophets: Jonah 2012 Pastor Geoffrey Cohen

### **Torah Portion:**

#### Exodus 4:22-23

22 Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the L-rd: "Israel is My son, My firstborn. 23 So I say to you, let My son go that he may serve Me. But if you refuse to let him go, indeed I will kill your son, your firstborn.""

#### **Exodus 13:1-2**

13 Then the L-rd spoke to Moses, saying, 2 "Consecrate to Me all the firstborn, whatever opens the womb among the children of Israel, both of man and beast; it is Mine."

#### Colossians 1:15

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.

#### Colossians 1:18

18 And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.

### **Romans 1:16**

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Messiah, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.

## **Service Portion:**

1) The Word of the L-rd came to Jonah a second time....

#### Jonah 1:1-3

Now the word of the L-rd came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it; for their wickedness has come up before Me." <sup>3</sup> But Jonah arose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the L-rd. He went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid the fare, and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish from the presence of the L-rd.

Now the word of the L-rd came to Jonah the second time, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you." <sup>3</sup> So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the L-rd. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, a three-day journey *in extent*. <sup>4</sup> And Jonah began to enter the city on the first day's walk. Then he cried out and said, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!"

<sup>5</sup> So the people of Nineveh believed G-d, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them. <sup>6</sup> Then word came to the king of Nineveh; and he arose from his throne and laid aside his robe, covered *himself* with sackcloth and sat in ashes. <sup>7</sup> And he caused *it* to be proclaimed and published throughout Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything; do not let them eat, or drink water. <sup>8</sup> But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily to G-d; yes, let every one turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. <sup>9</sup> Who can tell *if* G-d will turn and relent, and turn away from His fierce anger, so that we may not perish?

<sup>10</sup> Then G-d saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and G-d relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it.

2) The gifts and calling are without repentance.

Romans 11:29

<sup>29</sup> For the gifts and the calling of G-d *are* irrevocable

Jonah 1:7 – 10

<sup>7</sup> And they said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, that we may know for whose cause this trouble *has come* upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. <sup>8</sup> Then they said to him, "Please tell us! For whose cause *is* this trouble upon us? What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?"

<sup>9</sup> So he said to them, "I *am* a Hebrew; and I fear the L-rd, the G-d of heaven, who made the sea and the dry *land*." <sup>10</sup> Then the men were exceedingly afraid, and said to him, "Why have you done this?" For the men knew that he fled from the presence of the L-rd, because he had told them.

3) G-d is more merciful than we are!

Jonah 3:10-4:3

10 Then G-d saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and G-d relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it.

1 But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he became angry. 2 So he prayed to the L-rd, and said, "Ah, L-rd, was not this what I said when I was still in my country? Therefore I fled previously to Tarshish; for I know that You are a gracious and merciful G-d, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, One who relents from

doing harm. 3 Therefore now, O L-rd, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live!"

# Colossians 4:17

17 And say to Archippus, "Take heed to the ministry which you have received in the L-rd, that you may fulfill it."
