### **Discuss**

- 1. Can you think of a time Jesus appears in human form in the Old Testament?
- 2. Why do you think Jesus revealed Himself in the Old Testament before He came to redeem us?
- 3. Read Colossians 1:15. What does it mean for us that Jesus is the visible image of God?
- 4. Read John 6:46. A mediator is someone who stands in the gap or represents someone else. Why do you think God sent Jesus as our mediator?
- 5. What does it mean to you to know that Jesus came to earth to make a way for us to have relationship with God?
- 6. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?
